The story includes the rise of the Village from the decay and ruin of the 18<sup>th</sup> century into prosperity. 'Memoirs of Village Life' by one who was there ; 'The story of Ferriby Hall from the 12<sup>th</sup> century to 1844' ; The story of the nationally acclaimed Miller Poet, Robert Franklin publisher of 'The Miller's Muse' 1824, 'Ode to the Church' and many others. *But the 'jewel' of this work must be the publication of the drawing book of the recently orphaned Charlotte Nelthorpe who was the last of that family to be a Villager, 26 pictures 1843/44 that show the Parish, Village and Hall at an important time in their history, when the Humber was encroaching and Reads Island was born.*
