WARD NEWS FOR AUGUST 2013

Crime levels in August close to monthly average

37 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in August 2013. 28 of these crimes were in Brigg town, including 8 assaults. Across the ward 4 incidents involved criminal damage, 18 involved theft or attempted theft (8 of these were burglaries, none of which involved entering domestic dwellings). There were two cases of arson.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during August 2013

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In August 2013, 211 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	24
Concerns about individuals and safety	36
Concerns about behaviour	86
Concerns about traffic	65

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR AUGUST 2013 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in August 2013

28 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month made up of:

- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 7 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Arson not endangering life
- 1 x Arson endangering life
- 4 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 4 x Criminal damage (to property)
- 1 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Aggravated taking (criminal damage)
- 3 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 3 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug etc

A total of 109 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in August, including:

- 23 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 21 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals, including one report of a sudden death
- 3 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 19 traffic related matters
- 17 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in August 2013

- 1 x Burglary not in a dwelling (attempted theft of petrol)
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling

9 other matters required police attention, including two reports of property being left insecure (windows open). Police were involved on two occasions when individuals were being taken to hospital. A vehicle was reported where the driver could have been over the permitted alcohol limit.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in August 2013

- 1 x Theft (scrap metal)
- 1 x Racially aggravated harassment (not in the village)

24 other matters required police attention, twelve of which were traffic related. Three calls related to travellers moving onto private land on Elsham Wold. A dog was

reported left in a car in hot sunshine, which the RSPCA dealt with. Three reports were received from the village involving tensions between neighbours.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in August 2013

- 1 x Burglary not in a dwelling
- 1 x Fraud

47 other concerns have required police attention. 31 of these were traffic-related. Five calls involved concern for the safety of individuals. Two calls related to domestic tensions. A report was received that youths were damaging the public toilets.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in August 2013

Police were called when a former tenant threatened the landlord of a property in the village.

Worlaby

No recorded crimes in August 2013

A complaint received about a noisy party. Five other calls related to domestic tensions and child custody issues.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in August 2013

Concern was reported regarding an elderly person at the roadside. Police were called when a burglar alarm sounded. No evidence was found of any intruders.

Horkstow

No recorded crimes in August 2013

A group of people near Horkstow Bridge were reported throwing stones at a passing boat.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in August 2013

- 1 x Having a bladed article in a public place

Police were called on 11 other occasions. These included three domestic issues, an individual threatening suicide, and two road-related concerns.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in August 2013

2 x Burglary not in a dwelling

A cyclist called alleging verbal abuse from local farmers. Concern was expressed for a woman with small children in a broken down vehicle.
