WARD NEWS FOR DECEMBER 2013

Average crime levels in December

42 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in December 2013. The average monthly total is around 43. 29 of these crimes were in Brigg town, including 9 assaults, 2 robberies, 11 other incidents of theft, just one burglary (in a shop) and 5 cases of criminal damage. Outside Brigg 5 incidents involved theft and 3 cases of assault. A case of aggravated vehicle taking from Vicarage Motors in Wrawby made headline news in the local paper.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during December 2013

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related. A major concern during December was the flooding at South Ferriby.

In December 2013, 209 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	20
Concerns about individuals and safety	32
Concerns about behaviour	89
Concerns about traffic	68

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR DECEMBER 2013 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in December 2013

36 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month made up of:

- 2 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 4 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 2 x Robbery (theft with force or threat)

- 1 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 7 x Theft from a shop
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug etc
- 3 x Common assault & Battery
- 5 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 107 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in December, including:

- 29 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 13 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 4 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 25 traffic related matters
- 18 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in December 2013

- 1 x Aggravated vehicle taking (from Vicarage Motors)
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Criminal damage (to property)

Police were called out to five traffic related incidents – including four collisions – and again when a dog was loose on the A18 and when people were reported walking on the hard shoulder of the motorway. They were also called to a domestic dispute.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in December 2013

- 1 x Making off without paying (at Barnetby Top Services)

Police were called to a neighbour dispute in the village and when an individual was seen acting suspiciously. Seven incidents in the area caused highway disruption, two caused by the high winds.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in December 2013

- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 3 x Common assault & Battery

Police have been called in on 47 other occasions on a wide range of matters; 25 of these were traffic-related. Six calls related to domestic tensions and there were five

concerns for the safety of individuals. Just two reports were received of rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour by youngsters.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in December 2013

Police were called to two domestic incidents. They were also called to a suspected burglary and to a possibly abandoned vehicle. In both cases all was in order.

Worlaby

No recorded crimes in December 2013

A caller reported mud on the road. Police helped ambulance crew to gain entry to a property. Reports were received of two suspicious individuals.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in December 2013

Police were called to two domestic incidents and helped an individual reporting receiving nuisance text messages.

Horkstow

No recorded crimes in December 2013

No other matters required police attention.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in December 2013

1 x Burglary (copper was stolen from a flooded house)
1 x Theft (other)

Out of 24 logged calls (far more than normal), at least 12 were related to the flooding resulting from the tidal surge early in the month. Six callers reported suspicious vehicles, hoping to get scrap from flooded property. On a separate occasion police were called to a dispute between a householder and a lodger.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in December 2013

1 x Theft (other)

Police were called on four traffic related matters. A caller also reported an unknown vehicle on his land.
