## WARD NEWS FOR APRIL 2014

### April crime total below average

31 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in April 2014, of which 21 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. There were 12 incidences of theft (including two of 'making off without paying'), 4 burglaries (two in a dwelling), 4 offences involving criminal damage (all in Brigg), and five incidents where there was assault (all in Brigg). Two incidents at the same address were recorded as arson.

### Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during April 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In April 2014, 172 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	35
Concerns about individuals and safety	19
Concerns about behaviour	61
Concerns about traffic	57

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

## REPORTS FOR APRIL 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

### Brigg

#### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

21 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 1 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 2 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft by an employee
- 1 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle

- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Making off without paying
- 1 x Arson endangering life
- 1 x Arson not endangering life
- 2 x Common assault & Battery
- 4 x Criminal damage (to property)
- 1 x Harassment

A total of 80 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in April, including:

- 12 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 5 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 0 sudden death
- 3 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 22 traffic related matters
- 19 other reports of suspicious activity

## **Wrawby**

*No recorded crimes in April 2014*

Police responded on nine other occasions. A loose horse was reported, as was a pedal cyclist on the motorway. A cyclist was in collision with a car, and two domestic incidents were addressed. Two suspicious circumstances were reported, and a complaint was received of loud music coming from a car. A case of inconsiderate driving was also reported.

## **Elsham**

*Recorded crimes in April 2014*

- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 1 x Making off without paying

Police were called to five traffic incidents, including when a vehicle hit a deer. A sudden death was reported at a local care home. A suspicious vehicle was reported near a potato store on the Wold.

## **Barnetby**

*Recorded crimes in April 2014*

- 1 x Having possession of a controlled drug – recorded on the motorway

Police were called on 35 other occasions, 19 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Three incidents involved tension between individuals, and three callers reported concern for other people's safety.

Five suspicious incidents were reported including one case of suspected poaching. It was reported that a puppy could have been poisoned by rat poison.

## **Bonby**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Inter-personal offence (in a domestic situation)

A caller reported a suspicious incident taking place in Scunthorpe.

## **Worlaby**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Theft in a dwelling  
1 x Fraud

Police were called on six other occasions over various matters, including a missing person (found safe and well), a personal alarm (activated by accident) and a civil matter relating to inheritance.

## **Saxby All Saints**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling (on a farm – damage only)

Police gave advice over a domestic incident. Two other calls reported concern for the safety of the same individual.

## **Horkstow**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Theft (other) (on a farm)

No other matters required police attention.

## **South Ferriby**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Theft (other)

Eight other incidents included two of highway disruption, a child reported walking unaccompanied beside the road, and an unknown vehicle parked all day at a farm – the occupants never left the vehicle.

## **Melton Ross and New Barnetby**

### *Recorded crimes in April 2014*

1 x Theft (other) (on the A18)

Six traffic incidents included animals on the road and a two vehicle collision involving injury. A suspicious vehicle turned out to be a taxi responding to a call.
