WARD NEWS FOR SEPTEMBER 2013

Crime levels in September remain close to monthly average

40 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in September 2013. 25 of these crimes were in Brigg town, including 8 assaults and 11 incidents of theft. Across the ward 6 incidents involved criminal damage, 22 involved theft or attempted theft - 3 of these were burglaries, two of which involved entering domestic dwellings.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during September 2013

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In September 2013, 186 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property

Concerns about individuals and safety

Concerns about behaviour

Concerns about traffic

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2013 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in September 2013

25 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month made up of:

- 1 x Threats to kill
- 1 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 4 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling

- 1 x Robbery (theft with force or threat)
- 2 x Theft in a dwelling
- 2 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 4 x Theft from a shop
- 1 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 3 x Common assault & Battery
- 3 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 117 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in September, including:

25 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents

17 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals, including two reports of a sudden death

7 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour

29 traffic related matters

17 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x Theft (from local business premises)

1 x Harassment (a 'road range' incident on Melton Road)

12 other matters required police attention, including a woman apparently trying to cross the motorway on foot, the smell of cannabis from a property, two minor traffic collisions and two reports of suspicious vehicles.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x Theft of a motor vehicle (from a farm)

1 x Making off without paying (From local filling station)

1 x Theft (other) (power tools from business premisies)

Poachers were reported on farmland at Elsham Top, with a further possible sighting near the B1206; suspicions were aroused when a man was seen with a metal bar near the A15; police were called on three occasions when broken down vehicles were causing highway disruption (all on the motorway or A15).

Barnetby

No recorded crimes in September 2013

Police have been called in on 34 other occasions on a wide range of matters; 17 of these were traffic-related. Six calls involved concern for the safety of individuals. Two calls related to domestic tensions.

Bonby

Recorded crimes in September 2013

2 x Theft in a dwelling

1 x Theft (other) (Cable theft from rural location)

1 x Criminal damage (damage to gates)

Concern was expressed about an individual trying to direct traffic. A caller was concerned that her details have been published on a web site. A neighbour was reported as being aggressive.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x Theft in a dwelling

Police were called on nine occasions over a wide range of issues, including a report of damage in the children's play area, the return of a missing person, and suspicious vehicle, a bicycle being found, and a report of four youngsters on motorbikes in woodland.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in September 2013

Police were called in a dispute over parking. A caller reported finding a bag containing clothes.

Horkstow

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x damage (to crops)

A caller suspects that the criminal damage was caused by poachers. Evidence was found on two occasions. A dead badger was reported on Middlegate Lane.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x Burglary in a dwelling (jewellery and valuables taken)

1 x Criminal damage (to a kitchen window)

Callers reported a suspicious vehicle and some possible rogue traders. Oil was also reported on Ferriby Hill.





Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in September 2013

1 x Burglary in a dwelling

1 x Theft (other)

(nothing taken) (overhead cabling in Middlegate Lane area)

Police were called to six traffic related incidents – four calls related to temporary traffic lights that were not working.
