Hare Coursing and Poaching in Rural Areas

Last year there were a number of vehicles linked to poaching across the North Lincolnshire area. The keepers of these vehicles have been sent letters.

PS Howard GARLICK the Neighbourhood Sergeant at Brigg Police Stations has organised regular Poaching patrols. Posters have been sent out called "POACHER HUNT." The Rural Crime and Poaching Initiative is ongoing. Humberside Police and local partners are committed to reducing countryside crime and illegal hunting.

There was a poaching patrol on the 21st September 2013 which involved a number of Special Police Constables patrolling dedicated rural areas targeting any poaching related calls, offering support and reassurance to the rural farming communities. The patrol(s) are being well received by the farmers with positive feedback being received.

It is clear that Rural Crime and Poaching will continued to be targeted and offender(s) dealt with accordingly.

WARD NEWS FOR OCTOBER 2013

Crime levels in October remain close to monthly average

43 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in October 2013. 22 of these crimes were in Brigg town, including 5 assaults, 5 incidents of theft and 10 of criminal damage. Across the ward 14 incidents involved criminal damage, 18 involved theft or attempted theft - 2 of these were burglaries, neither of which involved entering domestic dwellings.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during October 2013

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In October 2013, 182 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	11
Concerns about individuals and safety	35
Concerns about behaviour	80
Concerns about traffic	56

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR OCTOBER 2013 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in October 2013

22 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month made up of:

- 4 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 1 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Common law offences
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 10 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 98 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in October, including:

- 25 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 16 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals, including two reports of a sudden death
- 8 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 21 traffic related matters
- 18 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in October 2013

- 1 x Inter-personal offence
- 1 x Common assault and battery

A wallet was found in Vicarage Gardens; police were called by the ambulance service after an elderly person had fallen outside a local public house. Four callers reported suspicious vehicles or activity.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in October 2013

Seven road traffic incidents were reported, three of which involved deer. Police were also called regarding an ongoing dispute between neighbours, a possible abandoned vehicle, and a sighting of possible poachers.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in October 2013

- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Criminal damage (to property)

Police have been called in on 38 other occasions on a wide range of matters; 21 of these were traffic-related. Five calls involved concern for the safety of individuals. Three calls related to domestic tensions and there were four reports of rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour by youngsters.

Bonby

Recorded crimes in October 2013

- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 1 x Criminal damage

Police were called in regarding a missing person, an alleged assault and a suspected burglary, where it turned out that the householder's keys had been lost rather than stolen.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in October 2013

- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 1 x Criminal damage (to property)
- 1 x Fraud

Police were called when traffic cones were blown across the road; in response to a 'lifeline' call (all in order); and on three occasions regarding missing persons.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in October 2013

No other matters required police attention.

Horkstow

No recorded crimes in October 2013

Two reports were received of possible poachers.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in October 2013

- 1 x Common assault and battery
- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Criminal damage

Police were called on five occasions regarding the safety of individuals. Three traffic incidents were reported, as was a sudden death.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

No recorded crimes in October 2013

A problem was reported with temporary traffic lights on the A180.
