### WARD NEWS FOR FEBRUARY 2014

#### 33 offences in Brigg town pushes up February crime total

45 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in February 2014, of which 33 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. There were 13 incidences of theft, 8 burglaries (one in a dwelling), 11 offences involving criminal damage, and 9 incidents where there was assault.

# Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during February 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In February 2014, 140 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	
Concerns about individuals and safety	13
Concerns about behaviour	48
Concerns about traffic	69

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

## **REPORTS FOR FEBRUARY 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA**

#### Brigg

Recorded crimes in February 2014

33 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – nearly twice as many as in January - made up of:

- 1 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 3 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 4 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Robbery (theft with force or threat)
- 1 x Theft of a pedal cycle
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 1 x Theft of a motor vehicle

Protecting Communities, Targeting Chiminals

- 5 x Theft (other)
- 2 x Criminal damage endangering life
- 1 x Threat to destroy or damage
- 1 x Abuse of position of trust
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Racially aggravated harassment

A total of 81 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in December, including:

17 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents7 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals5 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour33 traffic related matters10 other reports of suspicious activity

#### Wrawby

Recorded crimes in February 2014

2 x Burglary (not in a dwelling)

Garages were broken into at two nearby properties on the same date. Power tools, cycles etc were stolen.

Police attended after a vehicle overturned on the motorway. Police were also called about a lost dog.

#### Elsham

Recorded crimes in February 2014

1 x Criminal damage

(at Barnetby Top Services)

Seven traffic related issues were reported on the motorway and A15. A white van was seen dumping mattresses in Barnetby Lane. Police were also called regarding dog fouling in the village.

#### Barnetby

Recorded crimes in February 2014

- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug etc
- 1 x Common assault & Battery

Police were called on 28 other occasions, 19 of which involved highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Four callers were concerned for the safety of individuals. Police were called to two domestic incidents.



No recorded crimes in February 2014

Police were called regarding two suspicious men at a property in the village. No offences were recorded.

#### Worlaby

#### No recorded crimes in February 2014

Police were called regarding possible hare coursing, a suspected financial scam, and in incident involving a firearm.

#### Saxby All Saints

#### No recorded crimes in February 2014

A man with a van was reported after offering to buy scrap metal but then leaving hurriedly before completing the transaction.

#### Horkstow

No recorded crimes in February 2014

No other matters required police attention.

#### **South Ferriby**

#### Recorded crimes in February 2014

1 x Theft (other) 1 x Common assault & Battery 1 x Criminal damage (to a vehicle)

Police were called on 11 other occasions – five of which were from the same individual. Four road traffic incidents were reported. A suspicious vehicle was reported at the quarry, and police were called over alleged underage drinking at a local pub.

#### Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in February 2014

1 x Theft from a motor vehicle (fuel)

Police received three reports of highway disruption on the A18.
