WARD NEWS FOR JULY 2014

Crime total in July is well below average

34 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in July 2014, of which 21 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. There were 10 incidences of theft and two of 'making off without paying' from petrol stations. There were 3 burglaries (one in a dwelling), 6 offences involving criminal damage and 10 incidents where there was assault or harassment.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during July 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In July 2014, 189 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows -

Concerns about property	25
Concerns about individuals and safety	23
Concerns about behaviour	78
Concerns about traffic	63

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

No Parking Cones at Village Events

In the past, Humberside Police have been able to provide parking cones to help avoid traffic congestion at village shows and events. Under new arrangements, event

organisers are asked to contact North Lincolnshire Council to facilitate this in future. Police will no longer be able to assist in placing cones at non-Police Incidents.

New campaign to protect sheds and outbuildings from burglary

The North Lincolnshire Safer Neighbourhoods team will shortly be contacting Parish Councils to promote a new campaign encouraging people to protect property stored in sheds and outbuildings. Burglary on this type of property is not increasing, but every incident can cause distress and loss to the victims. Shed alarms, the marking of cycles and the use of 'Immobilise' (<u>www.immobilise.com</u>) can all help protect property and aid its recovery if stolen. Brigg

Recorded crimes in July 2014

21 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month - made up of:


- 1 x Wounding with intent to do GBH
- 3 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 2 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Theft from a shop
- 4 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Making off without paying
- 3 x Common assault & Battery
- 3 x Criminal damage (to property)
- 1 x Harassment

A total of 80 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in July, including:

- 15 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 7 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 0 sudden death
- 9 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 19 traffic related matters
- 11 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby





1 x Theft of a pedal cycle

Police were called regarding a broken down vehicle on the motorway and in relation to two alleged traffic offences. Concern was reported for an individual's safety, and an incident aroused suspicion when a man in a car was seen apparently following some girls on bikes.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in July 2014

- 1 x Theft (other lead removed from a property in the village)
- 1 x Making off without paying (Barnetby Top)

Police were called to four traffic related incidents on the motorway or A15. A suspect vehicle was reported on the A15 and an alarm at premises on the industrial estate was activated in error.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in July 2014

- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Dangerously out of control dog

Police were called on 38 other occasions, 23 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. As last month three callers reported concern for other people's safety.

Bonby

Recorded crimes in July 2014

1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm

Police were called to an ongoing civil dispute, and to an incident when someone knocked on the caller's door late at night.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in July 2014



3 x Criminal damage

All three incidents (on different dates) involved smashed windows.

Police were called when a bus hit a car outside the primary school. Youths were also reported behaving irresponsibly – throwing rubbish etc.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in July 2014

Police were called when cows were reported loose on the road and when a dog escaped from its kennel into a neighbour's garden.

Horkstow

Recorded crimes in July 2014

1 x Assault

1 x Theft from a motor vehicle

Complaints were received about people on quad bikes causing a nuisance, and about bad driving on the main road. A cow was also reported on the road.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in July 2014

1 x Theft (other)

Police were also called on 18 occasions, four of which reported concern for youngsters swimming at Ferriby Sluice and four were traffic related. Other matters included two alleged assaults, and the remaining were various calls from a single individual whose concerns are well known to the police but can only be addressed by other agencies.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in July 2014

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

Police were called to five traffic related incidents.
