WARD NEWS FOR AUGUST 2014

Crime total in August is well below average

29 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in August 2014, of which 19 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. There were 10 incidences of theft and two of 'making off without paying' from petrol stations. There were 5 burglaries (none in a dwelling), 4 offences involving criminal damage and 5 incidents where there was assault or harassment.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during August 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In August 2014, 156 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR AUGUST 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in August 2014

19 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 3 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Serious inter-personal offence
- 3 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 1 x Theft from shops and stalls
- 5 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug etc
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle
- 3 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 82 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in August, including:

- 20 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 9 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 0 sudden death
- 5 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 19 traffic related matters
- 9 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in August 2014

- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Criminal damage (to property)

Police were called to a sudden death and in relation to an alleged traffic offence.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in August 2014

1 x Making off without paying (Barnetby Top)

Police were called to seven traffic related incidents on the motorway or A15. A fault was reported with the level crossing gates, and police were called after a vehicle crashed on a private road.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in August 2014

- 1 x Theft by an employee
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Public nuisance

The first two of these offences were at the same location.

Police were called on 41 other occasions, 26 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Four callers reported concern for other people's safety.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in August 2014

Police were called to a road traffic collision, to an ongoing domestic dispute, and when young people were reported causing a nuisance.

Worlaby

No recorded crimes in August 2014

Police were called with a concern for an individual's safety – which was all in order – and when young people were allegedly causing criminal damage.

Saxby All Saints

Recorded crimes in August 2014

1 x serious inter-personal offence

Police were called about mud and stones on the road and with reports of off road bikers with no helmets or lights.

Horkstow

Recorded crimes in August 2014

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

Police were called about a burnt out van on Middlegate Lane.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in August 2014

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

Police were also called on 12 occasions, three of these calls being traffic related. Other matters included two concerns for the safety of individuals, two calls about a missing person, and a report of an individual scavenging in a skip.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in August 2014

1 x Theft (other)

Police were also called to two traffic related incidents and to a concern for an individual's safety.
