WARD NEWS FOR OCTOBER 2014

Crime total in October remains well below average



24 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in October 2014, of which 15 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. There were 10 incidences of theft, and 5 of burglary (just one in a dwelling, where it was linked to an assault), 4 offences involving criminal damage (all in the centre of Brigg) and 5 incidents where there was an assault.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during October 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In October 2014, 209 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property	33
Concerns about individuals and safety	28
Concerns about behaviour	62
Concerns about traffic	86

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

Firearms Amnesty during first two weeks November

Humberside Police are offering an 'amnesty' for any firearms or ammunition handed in during the first two weeks of November (ending 8 pm on 16 November).

Items can be handed in at Scunthorpe or Grimsby Police Stations.



REPORTS FOR OCTOBER 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in October 2014

15 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 3 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Theft by an employee
- 2 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 2 x Theft from shops and stalls
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 4 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 105 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in October, including:

16	civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
16	incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
3	sudden death
5	reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
34	traffic related matters
17	other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

No recorded crimes in October 2014

Police dealt with three road traffic incidents in the village this month, the most serious of which involved the death of a driver. In another incident a schoolgirl on a bicycle collided with a car. In the third incident a car hit a dog. Police were also called after a sudden death at a care home, and after handbags had been found in a pub's beer garden. A caller also reported being verbally threatened by a dog walker.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in October 2014

1 x Theft from shop (Barnetby Top)

Six calls this month related to road traffic incidents. Two other caller reported hare coursers. Police were called when a driver at Barnetby Top asked the caller for money. Other matters dealt with included an allegation of attempted arson.

Barnetby



No recorded crimes in October 2014

Police were called on 41 other occasions, 31 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Other matters included two calls about a couple sleeping rough, a child allegedly being assaulted at school, and (as last month) a caller reporting finding dead badgers.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in October 2014

Police were called to a domestic dispute.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in October 2014

- 1 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 1 x Common assault
- 1 x Other assault

Police were called following a road rage incident. A caller reported finding scrap metal in suspicious circumstances. Police also responded to a domestic dispute. On three occasions reports have been taken re un-insured drivers.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in October 2014

No other matters required police attention.

Horkstow

No recorded crimes in October 2014

A caller reported an allegation of a possible attempt to set a fire.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in October 2014

1 x Theft from a motor vehicle



Police were also called to two traffic incidents, to a domestic argument, and to a report of suspicious circumstances, when an individual was seen photographing expensive cars.
