WARD NEWS FOR NOVEMBER 2014

Crime total in November returns to average

43 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in November 2014, of which 34 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. 18 of the Brigg offences involved criminal damage, burglary or theft on commercial premises in the town centre. Across the Ward, there were 18 incidences of theft, and 12 of burglary (two in a dwelling, both in Brigg), 5 offences involving criminal damage (all in Brigg) and 5 incidents where there was a reported assault.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during November 2014

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In November 2014, 194 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property
Concerns about individuals and safety
Concerns about behaviour
Concerns about traffic

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.



REPORTS FOR NOVEMBER 2014 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in November 2014

34 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 2 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Sexual assault on a female
- 2 x Burglary in a dwelling
- 6 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Robbery (theft with force or threat)
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 12 x Theft from a shop
- 1 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug Class C (other)
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle
- 5 x Criminal damage (to property)

A total of 104 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in November, including:

- 13 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 12 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 0 sudden death
- 5 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 30 traffic related matters
- 21 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in November 2014

2 x Theft (other), one of which was cable theft.

Police were called to two road traffic incidents, one which involved a vehicle in a ditch, and on three occasions where concerns were reported for the safety of individuals. A caller reported finding a stray dog, and another called to report their suspicions that a charity clothing bag collection in the village was fake which was found to not be the case.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in November 2014



1 x Theft

(on the industrial estate)

A sudden death was reported at a care home in the village. Police were also called to two incidents where dead deer were blocking the carriageway, and on two occasions where pedestrians were at risk near the A15.

Barnetby

No recorded crimes in November 2014

Police were called on 33 other occasions, 22 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences. Other matters included a sudden death, four calls reporting concern for the safety of individuals and a civil dispute about a vehicle.

Bonby

No recorded crimes in November 2014

Police were called on four occasions to domestic disputes – three at the same address. A sudden death was reported. Police also attended three traffic incidents.

Worlaby

Recorded crimes in November 2014

- 1 x Burglary not in a dwelling
- 1 x Common assault
- 1 x Theft (other)

Police were called regarding strange noises heard in a house at night – and also with information about a drink driver.

Saxby All Saints

No recorded crimes in November 2014

A suspicious vehicle was reported in a farm yard.

Horkstow

Recorded crimes in November 2014

1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

A suspicious vehicle was investigated – no offences were found.





South Ferriby

No recorded crimes in November 2014

Police were also called to five traffic incidents. Two other callers reported concerns of the safety of individuals.
