WARD NEWS FOR JANUARY 2015

Crime total in January below average once again

25 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in January 2015, of which 18 were in Brigg town. The average monthly total is around 43. Across the Ward, there were 6 incidences of theft, and 6 of burglary (none in a dwelling). There were 6 incidents of assault, but none involving criminal damage.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during January 2015

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In January 2015, 149 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows –

Concerns about property 13
Concerns about individuals and safety 22
Concerns about behaviour 56
Concerns about traffic 58

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

Across the three wards of Brigg District, Police were called to nine sudden deaths this month. This is a routine procedure and in no case was there anything suspicious. However it is rare to see more than one or two a month.



REPORTS FOR JANUARY 2015 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in January 2015

17 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 3 x Assault
- 1 x Serious inter-personal offence
- 4 x Burglary not in dwelling
- 1 x Other burglary in a building other than a dwelling
- 1 x Theft from the person
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Theft from shops and stalls
- 3 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle

A total of 69 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in January, including:

- 9 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 7 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 1 sudden death
- 3 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 17 traffic related matters
- 17 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in January 2015

1 x Robbery

Police were called on 15 other occasions, nine of which involved traffic related issues. Two calls were about vehicles parked on pavements, and a third caller reported a vehicle seemingly abandoned in a bus bay. Three calls related to civil or domestic issues or nuisance neighbours. Police were called in response to an elderly person's panic alarm, and also in response to a sudden death.

Elsham

Recorded crimes in January 2015



1 x Burglary not in a dwelling

Tools stolen from a farm outbuilding

In the village Police were called to a traffic collision near Elsham Hall and to a sudden death. They were also called to a tractor and trailer parked suspiciously at the side of the road. Elsewhere 8 traffic incidents were reported on the M180 and A15, poachers were reported near Middlegate Lane, and an alarm sounded in error at premises on the Elsham Wold estate.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in January 2015

- 1 x Accosting(Non Criminal)
- 1 x Theft from a (motor) vehicle
- 1 x Breach of non-molestation order
- 1 x Having Possession Of A Controlled Drug (arrest made on the motorway)

Police were called on 33 other occasions, 22 of which involved traffic collisions, highway disruption or alleged traffic offences – all on the motorway or A180. Four callers reported concern for the safety of individuals (again all on the motorway or A180). In the village three callers reported suspected fraud, and police also followed up calls involving a neighbour dispute, harassment and a civil matter relating to a vehicle.

Bonby

Recorded crimes in January 2015

1 x Harassment

Police were called when a civil dispute over property led to allegations of burglary. Two concerns were reported over the safety of children. Police also attended after two sudden deaths.

Worlaby

No recorded crimes in January 2015

A car was reported on the wrong side of the road. A post was also reported leaning across the road in the aftermath of a gale. An individual was reported fly-tipping, and a caller reported that dogs had started chasing her own dogs as she was out walking.
