What would you do if you found a box of abandoned rabbits on a grass verge or you have missed your last bus home? In circumstances like these, for too many people, their first reaction is to phone the Police!

More than one in four calls that received on the 999 system are inappropriate, either because they simply are not emergencies requiring immediate police assistance or they are not police matters at all. Some members of the public opt for 999 because they have no credit left on their phones or because they wrongly assume they will get dealt with more speedily if they ring 999 rather than 101.

A new campaign – **ClickB4Ucall** – encourages people not to phone the police unless it's a real emergency, but to visit the police website <http://www.humberside.police.uk> instead – in other words to “*click before you call*”.

As more and more people are using smartphones and subscribe to social media, Humberside Police is fast developing its own use of social media where help is increasingly available.

WARD NEWS FOR MAY 2015

Crime total in May remains above average

45 crimes were recorded in the Brigg and Wolds Ward in May 2015, of which 33 were in Brigg town. Across the Ward, there were 17 incidences of theft, and 12 of burglary (2 in dwellings). There were 6 incidents of assault, 5 involving criminal damage and 5 other offences.

Other concerns addressed by the Brigg and Wolds Neighbourhood Police Team during May 2015

The greater proportion of the work of Neighbourhood Police Teams relates to public and individual needs and concerns that are not directly crime-related.

In May 2015, 93 concerns were responded to by the Brigg and Wolds team as follows;

Concerns about property	12
Concerns about individuals and safety	18
Concerns about behaviour	30
Concerns about traffic	33

Individual incidents vary enormously in the amount of police time required to deal with them. In a good proportion of cases people's legitimate suspicions and concerns prove to be unfounded.

REPORTS FOR MAY 2015 FROM YOUR LOCAL AREA

Brigg

Recorded crimes in May 2015

33 crimes were recorded in Brigg during the month – made up of:

- 2 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Breach of ASBO
- 2 x Other burglary in a dwelling
- 9 x Other burglary in a building other than a dwelling
- 1 x Theft from the person
- 1 x Theft in a dwelling
- 4 x Theft from a motor vehicle
- 3 x Theft from shops and stalls
- 2 x Theft of a motor vehicle and TWOC
- 2 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Common assault & Battery
- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle
- 3 x Criminal damage under £5000
- 1 x Dangerous driving

A total of 60 other incidents and matters of individual or community concern have been reported in May, including:

- 13 civil or domestic or inter-personal incidents
- 10 incidents where there was concern for the safety of individuals
- 0 sudden death
- 1 reports of rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- 13 traffic related matters

11 other reports of suspicious activity

Wrawby

Recorded crimes in May 2015

- 1 x Interference with a motor vehicle
- 1 x Criminal damage under £5000

Police were called routinely after a sudden death at a care home, and when someone was seen walking on the motorway. Police were also called to a domestic dispute and after a caller had received a suspicious email.

Elsham

No recorded crimes in May 2015

Three traffic incidents were reported on the A15, including an injured buzzard. A caller reported sighting a missing person close to Elsham Top.

Barnetby

Recorded crimes in May 2015

- 1 x Assault causing actual bodily harm
- 1 x Theft (other)
- 1 x Possessing controlled drug Class B Cannabis
- 1 x Criminal damage under £5000

Police were called on 22 other occasions, of which 19 involved traffic related incidents – all of them on the motorway or A180. Other matters included someone seen walking on the railway line, someone seen trying to sell a television from the back of a van, and information about a missing person.

Bonby

Recorded crimes in May 2015

- 2 x assault (a single incident involving teenagers)

No other matters were logged for action by police.

Worlaby

No recorded crimes in May 2015

Information was received about a child missing from home.

Saxby All Saints

Recorded crimes in May 2015

1 x Theft (other) (from Northern Power Grid)

No other matters were logged for action by police.

Horkstow

No recorded crimes in May 2015

A caller reported finding a peacock.

South Ferriby

Recorded crimes in May 2015

1 x Burglary in a building other than a dwelling
1 x Theft from a vehicle

No other matters were logged for action by police.

Melton Ross and New Barnetby

Recorded crimes in May 2015

1 x Theft of a motor vehicle

Four traffic related incidents were reported on the A18. A caller also reported a scam involving a removal company.
